### COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT COMMISSION

The Community Engagement Commission advises the City Council on matters related to community needs and issues, crime and prevention, public awareness, community involvement, and human rights issues. The commission also helps plan and facilitate community events such as Human Rights Day and the Ice Cream Social.

The Community Engagement Commission meets on the third Monday of the month at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall.

### PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

The Parks & Recreation Commission advises the Council on matters related to the operation of the City's public parks and the City recreation program.

### **ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION**

The Environment Commission advises the City Council on matters related to environmental issues, including recycling and waste disposal, community gardens, and storm water runoff. \*\*Final Paving - On August 14 and 15, the contractor will be paving the top layer of asphalt. The new asphalt can be driven on I hour after it is rolled; however, we ask that you avoid sharply turning your wheels, especially while stopped, as it can leave permanent markings on the finished surface.

### **RESOURCES FOR THE UNSHELTERED**

If you aware of unsheltered individuals within the city, with no indication of crime or immediate safety concerns, contact City Hall during business hours at 651-792-7600 or by email at mail@falconheights.org. Both the City and Ramsey County Sheriff's Office work in partnership with Housing Stability in Ramsey County so that a Housing Stability representative can make contact and offer emergency shelter resources to them. If there are any indications of violence, crime, or information that the person may be a threat to themselves or others, contact 911. It should also be noted that Ramsey County has a Homeless Services Team that regularly makes contact with those on the street to keep track and provide assistance, if needed.

#### **Community Park**

- Upper Picnic Area (against building): 5 picnic tables, trash bins

Each picnic area is \$20 + tax for a half day or \$35 + tax for a full day.


