PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

Visitors will experience a sound bath session of song and music, can participate in a quilting station, and will hear poetry by local artists in an open mic opportunity. Guests and community members are sure to have a multi-sensory experience, an opportunity to contribute to the space, and will have something to walk away with to remember the day.

5 Energy Conservation Ideas

With the weather recently, you may be starting to see those electric bills creep up just like the heat has been. Here are ten energy conservation tips to potentially save you some money down the road!

- I.Turn your refrigerator down. Refrigerators account for as much as I3.7% of the total household energy use. To increase energy savings, set your fridge to 37 degrees Fahrenheit and your freezer to 3 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 2. Use energy-efficient light bulbs. Using CFL or LED bulbs use 25-35% less energy, compared to regular incandescent bulbs.
- 3. Clean or replace air filters as recommended. When the appliances have to work harder to deal with dirty air filters, energy consumption goes up!
- 4. Do full loads. Get the most energy-saving use from each run cycle by running full loads in both your washing machine and dishwasher.
- 5.Check for air leaks in your house. You already pay for your warm air in the winter and cool air in the summer. Don't let that air escape! Check your windows and doors for cracks and gaps, and seal them up with weather stripping or caulk.



RECYCLING FUN FACT

The average person creates almost five pounds of trash per day, and in 2018, American consumers created 146.2 million tons of trash that ended up in landfills. Thankfully, Americans also recycled and composted almost 94 million tons of waste – a rate that has grown more than 300% in the past 38 years.


