




Q3 If you reside in Falcon Heights, which neighborhood do you reside in? See map above.





Q4 Did you see police officers patrolling your neighborhood during the course of the State Fair?





Q5 On a scale of Strongly Disagree to Strongly Agree, there was adequate policing INSIDE the fairgrounds during the course of the State Fair.











Q9 On a scale of Strongly Disagree to Strongly Agree, 2023 fairgoers were respectful of personal property.







Q11 On a scale of Strongly Disagree to Strongly Agree, you felt safer in your neighborhood this year during the 2023 MN State Fair.










