

The City of Falcon Heights has four City Commissions, which serve the City Council in an advisory capacity. Commissioners are volunteers including Falcon Heights residents, local business owners, and business designees who have been appointed by the Mayor and approved by the City Council.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT COMMISSION

The Community Engagement Commission advises the City Council on matters related to community needs and issues, crime and prevention, public awareness, community involvement, and human rights issues. The commission also helps plan and facilitate community events such as Human Rights Day and the Ice Cream Social.

2023 Pavement Management Project

Ramsey County Cleveland Avenue Reconstruction

Work is ongoing between Buford and Larpenteur Avenues. The traffic signals at the Larpenteur and Cleveland intersection are working, and the final layer of asphalt has been installed. Pavement marking, lights and turf restoration is ongoing.


The City has long been planning the renovation of Community Park, located at 2050
Roselawn Avenue. Since the 1970s, the City leased
the land from the University of Minnesota. With our lease expiring, the City purchased the property from the university for \$1.1 million this past May.

Back in 2014, the City hired WSB, a civil engineering and planning firm, to develop a parks master plan. The initial plans included multiple concepts for the renovation of Community Park. The City has once again hired WSB as the project manager and HCM Architects as the architects for the renovation. Both firms have extensive municipal park renovation experience, including both firms as the partners in the Roseville parks renovation.

The total park renovation budget is between \$2.5 to \$3 million. It is estimated that the new building will take approximately half of the budget, and the parking lot, design fees, site features, and to-be- determined park amenities will be the other half of the project cost. The City has been strategically saving for this renovation for many years, and will be able to pay a majority of the project cost through existing reserves. We also have a bonding request in to the State of Minnesota for \$1 million, and are applying for a wide variety of grants to assist with the project. Any remaining costs for the project will be financed through a municipal bond as a debt issuance. The City remains in a strong financial position with minimal debt.

DEVELOPMENT

In early 2023, the City of Falcon Heights applied for and received a grant from Ramsey County to review the two most critical transportation corridors within the city, Snelling Avenue and Larpenteur Avenue. The project is to evaluate the existing land uses along the two corridors and identify areas of potential future redevelopment and reinvestment to meet future housing and business needs. With the outside grant funding, the City is undertaking a corridor study that will look at existing sites, note economic and market trends, and gain input from the Falcon Heights community about what type of development they would like to see in the future. The Planning Commission will serve as the steering committee providing feedback and shepherding the study throughout the process.

If you haven't returned your absentee ballot, you can vote in person at your polling place. Your absentee ballot will be spoiled (made invalid), and you will be issued a new ballot to cast at the polling place.

For a small processing fee of \$4 you can register at the Direct Marketing Association's (DMA) consumer website DMAchoice.org, and choose what catalogs, magazine offers, and other mail you want to get. DMAchoice will stop most, but not all, promotional mail. DMAchoice.org also has an Email Preference Service that lets you get less unsolicited commercial email. Registration is free and will last for six years.

5 ways to weatherize your home

As the cooler months settle in, consider these relatively cost-effective ways to weatherize your home. Weatherizing helps a home maintain temperature, conserve energy and save money on energy bills.



I. Consult the pros.

Request a consultation with a <u>Home Energy Squad</u> technician through Xcel Energy to help you understand opportunities to save energy and money on utility bills. Income-qualified customers may qualify for free visits.

- 2. Install (more) insulation in your attic.
- Since hot air rises, a lot of heat escapes through attics. Installing insulation in the attic can help keep heat inside your home. Even if your attic has some insulation, you might be able to add more. Learn how to install attic insulation here.
- 3. Insulate your windows with plastic film.

A great option for renters, installing plastic film insulation is an affordable way to combat drafty (especially single-pane) windows. Make sure to read the directions on the package beforehand to set yourself up for success. At the end of the season, put plastic film insulation in the trash, not the recycling. Despite its name, plastic film insulation is NOT accepted with plastic bag/film recycling.

- 4. Seal gaps around windows and doors.
- Before the weather turns especially frigid, use caulk or weather stripping to seal gaps around windows and doors. You can also put fabric or plastic sealers along the bottom of doors to prevent cold air from coming through.
- 5. Insulate outlets and light switches.

Did you know cold air can seep through outlets and light switches located on exterior walls? Add foam gaskets (like this one) to keep the warm air in and the cold air out.
