Hockey Rink at Curtiss Field

Public Works completed setting up the hockey rink at Curtiss Fleld. Last week, the Mobile Mini warming shelter was delivered. This week, the electrical connection will be routed to the warming shelter.

Street Sweeping

Weather permitting, Public Works will street sweep areas throughout the city that have heavy leaf accumulation.

Sidewalks

Public Works marked offset sidewalk panels that are along the city's snow removal route. This week, they will start grinding down the offset panels.

Community Park

Falcon Heights and the Monarch Joint Venture were awarded a grant from St. Paul Garden Club earlier this year. As part of the grant, the butterfly habitat signs were replaced last week around the pond at Community Park.

Ramsey County Ski Trails

Snowmaking has begun and one trail is open now at the <u>Winter Recreation Area</u> <u>at Battle Creek</u>. This easy 0.6 km trail loop around the pond is perfect for skiers of all skill levels and is lighted from sunset until IO PM. When cooler temperatures settle in and the snow falls, 56 km of natural snow trails will open. Be sure to watch the <u>cross-</u> <u>country ski trail conditions page</u> for the latest trail opening info.

Don't forget to get your mutual Ramsey County/Saint Paul ski pass before hitting the trails. Passes may be purchased <u>online</u> now or in person starting Dec. I at the Battle Creek Recreation Center.



Snelling Larpenteur CORRIDOR DEVELOPMENT

In early 2023, the City of Falcon Heights applied for and received a grant from Ramsey County to review the two most critical transportation corridors within the city, Snelling Avenue and Larpenteur Avenue. The project is to evaluate the existing land uses along the two corridors and identify areas of potential future redevelopment and reinvestment to meet future housing and business needs. With the outside grant funding, the City is undertaking a corridor study that will look at existing sites, note economic and market trends, and gain input from the Falcon Heights community about what type of development they would like to see in the future. The Planning Commission will serve as the steering committee providing feedback and shepherding the study throughout the process.

In 2023 SPRWS launched an ambitious 10-year plan to remove all lead service lines in both private and public property. Lead Free SPRWS is offering free replacement to customers.

SPRWS is actively planning the next ten years of the program by working on obtaining funding and choosing an appropriate number of replacements to complete each year based on the funding. The SPRWS service area will be divided into project zones and they will prioritize based on several factors. Information will be shared on <u>SPRWS website</u> as soon as it is available. Reduce Lead in Drinking Water

There are steps you can take to reduce exposure if you have a lead service line or lead in your interior plumbing:

- Let the water run for 3-5 minutes before using it for drinking or cooking if the water has collected in your plumbing for more than 6 hours.
- Use cold water for drinking, cooking, and preparing baby formula. Hot water absorbs more lead from pipes than cold water.
- At least once a quarter, remove your aerator from your faucet and rinse the filter out.
- Use a water pitcher or point of use filter for your drinking water/

CenturyLink Outage

Residents who are experiencing landline outages should report it directly to CenturyLink by signing in to their account or by calling the customer service line at 833-591-0933. You can also check for outages in the CenturyLink App.

CenturyLink also has a Troubleshooter that allows you to check for outages, test your service, make and see repair appointments. This tool can also be utilized to sign up for updates regarding any service outages. Click here for the Troubleshooter.

You can still check for voice messages. In most areas, there are two ways to check your messages away from home: call home and interrupt your outgoing message with #, *, or 2 (varies by location) or call your retrieval number. The number was included in the welcome letter you received when you signed up for voicemail service.

If you don't have your retrieval number, please <u>contact CenturyLink</u> to get it.

Any time you're checking messages from a phone line other than the one your voicemail service is on, you are required to enter your PIN. Did you forget your PIN? You can <u>reset it</u>.


A few ways to be greener with your holiday lights

Many of us cherish the sight of our streets illuminated by holiday lights this time of year. There are ways to make those displays more environmentally friendly. For example, you can cut down on energy consumption by making sure you use efficient LED lights (which are now the predominant type sold). And by setting up a timer that turns off the lights when you go to bed, you'll not only save money, you'll also lessen light pollution-star-gazers, sensitive sleepers, and <u>certain animal species</u> will be glad you did.

Eventually string lights fail. Sometimes there's an easy fix -a replacement bulb or a fuse. If it is doable, you might get some free repair help at one of the <u>Ramsey County</u> <u>Fix-It Clinics</u>. But if it's time to dispose of old lights, it's best to do so properly. Repowered at 860 Vandalia Street in St Paul will take them for just 49 cents per pound (the lights are typically very light, so it won't cost you much). Repowered is open weekdays until 4:30 pm and on certain Saturday mornings. You might also look into the free <u>St. Paul Public Library's Lights Recycling Program</u> that runs until January 22nd. The Ramsey County Hazardous Waste Facility at 5 Empire Drive in St Paul is another good option, and it is open year-round.
