### **Repairs**


Public Works will be making repairs to the fleet as needed.

#### Tips for Managing Snow and Ice From Capital Region Watershed District

- Shovel, Sweep or Scrape: Have the proper tools to clear driveways and sidewalks. Remove snow early and often to reduce compacted snow and ice.
- Swap the Salt: Try using grit or sand for traction on ice instead of melting the ice with salt.
- Select the Correct Product: Road salt only works when the pavement temperature is above 15 degrees. Read the label of your de-icer for usage instructions and temperature. In colder temperatures, use different products like sand or grit.
- Scatter Salt Sparingly: A 12-ounce coffee cup holds enough salt to cover a 20-foot driveway or 10 sidewalk squares. Scatter salt grains 3 inches apart. Only use salt on ice! Don't put salt on wet pavement or snow.
- Save & Reuse: Sweep up grit and sand or leftover salt to reuse as needed.
- Use Sunny Days: Take advantage of sunshine on pavement and work to break up lingering ice and snow with a heavy-duty snow and ice scraper or shovel



#### **Ramsey County Board of Commissioners Approves 2024-25 Budget**

On Tuesday, Dec. 12, the Ramsey County Board of Commissioners unanimously approved the 2024-25 county budget.

The budget for 2024 totals \$808,498,799 which represents a 2.9% overall budget increase from 2023. The 6.75% levy increase for 2024 was driven by a shift away from federal and state one-time resources that were available during the emergency pandemic. The budget for 2025 totals \$835,076,779, with an 3.3% budget increase from 2024 and a maximum 4.75% levy increase that is proposed to be reduced once estimates for future cannabis sales tax revenue can be incorporated.

The 2024 budget was mitigated by a \$6 million increase in county program aid from the state of Minnesota. Without this critical support, the levy was estimated to be 1.76% higher. The budget was developed with a resident-centric focus by incorporating key learnings from the COVID-19 pandemic and extensive community feedback received from online comments, phone calls and public hearings.


#### <u>Music Under Glass</u>
