PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

The Parks & Recreation Commission advises the Council on matters related to the operation of the City's public parks and the City recreation program.

ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION

The Commission also develops and recommends implementation of environmentally friendly initiatives such as rain barrels and solar panels, supporting and advancing the City's participation in the GreenStep Cities program.

PUBLIC WORKS & <<< COMMUNITY UPDATES

Ice Skating

Public Works will continue flooding the rinks at Curtiss Field and at Grove Park. They are hopeful the rinks can open this week. Residents can call the City's weather line at 651-792-7607 to determine the most up-to-date warming house hours at Curtiss Field during the skating season.

Repairs

Public Works will be making repairs to the fleet as needed.

Trash

Public Works will be emptying all citymaintained trash receptacles.

Cleaning

Public Works will be cleaning all of their equipment as well as clean sump throughs in all the floor drains in the Public Works garage bays.

Tips for Managing Snow and Ice From Capital Region Watershed District

- Shovel, Sweep or Scrape: Have the proper tools to clear driveways and sidewalks. Remove snow early and often to reduce compacted snow and ice.
- Swap the Salt: Try using grit or sand for traction on ice instead of melting the ice with salt.
- Select the Correct Product: Road salt only works when the pavement temperature is above 15 degrees. Read the label of your de-icer for usage instructions and temperature. In colder temperatures, use different products like sand or grit.
- Scatter Salt Sparingly: A 12-ounce coffee cup holds enough salt to cover a 20-foot driveway or 10 sidewalk squares. Scatter salt grains 3 inches apart. Only use salt on ice! Don't put salt on wet pavement or snow.
- Save & Reuse: Sweep up grit and sand or leftover salt to reuse as needed.
- Use Sunny Days: Take advantage of sunshine on pavement and work to break up lingering ice and snow with a heavy-duty snow and ice scraper or shovel








COMMUNITY PARK TIMELINE

Chicken Keeping

Have you ever thought about adding a few chickens to your backyard? Well, if so, now is a great time to start planning for your new chicken additions! Keeping chickens can be a rewarding and enjoyable experience. Whether you're interested in fresh eggs, natural pest control, or simply having feathered friends in your backyard.

The City of Falcon Heights has an Information Packet to learn about keeping chickens, the permitting process and additional resources. The city requires a permit for chicken keeping and allows up to 4 hens. Be sure to access the Information Packet here.

Additionally, there are many resources both from the <u>UofM Extension</u> and <u>local</u> <u>classes</u> to connect with other urban chicken keepers. Learn about housing, space requirements, feed, egg production, behavior, socialization, cleaning and maintenance, and predator protection.

Apart from the delicious fresh eggs, it is exciting to see each chicken's own personality, and observing their behaviors can be fascinating. With proper care, attention, and a suitable environment, keeping chickens can be a delightful and sustainable addition to your backyard.

MN DNR Ice Safety Guidelines

Ice is variable and people should be very cautious, including in northern Minnesota. Don't rely on reports alone, check it yourself. If you are going out on the ice, check the ice and not just for thickness. White and rotten ice can be deceiving. If the ice is white, double the below ice thickness guidelines. In most places, people should wait before taking out ATVs or other vehicles out on the ice. The ice is just not ready yet.

No ice can ever be considered "safe ice," but following these guidelines available at mndnr.gov/icesafety can help minimize the risk:

- Always wear a life jacket or float coat on the ice (except when in a vehicle).
- Carry ice picks, rope, an ice chisel and tape measure.
- Check ice thickness at regular intervals; conditions can change quickly.
- Bring a cell phone or personal locator beacon.
- Don't go out alone; let someone know about trip plans and expected return time.
- Before heading out, inquire about conditions and known hazards with local experts.
- Parents and guardians should talk with their children about staying away from the ice unless there's adult supervision. This includes lakes and rivers, as well as neighborhood ponds, retention ponds and anywhere ice forms.


Skating Fun in Falcon Heights
