

Falcon Heights Community Park Renovation

After receiving public feedback and discussion, the City Council approved the park renderings.

State Fair Policies and Procedures Task Force

At its recent meeting on Wednesday, February 14th, the City Council approved the creation of a State Fair Policies Task Force that will meet in 2024 and 2025.

A State Fair Policies and Procedures Task Force (State Fair Task Force) was created in February 2023 and they began their work in June. The group met over a dozen times over the span of a few months to develop policies to improve the quality of life for residents during the State Fair.

Prior to completion, the State Fair Task Force developed a report for consideration by the City Council. It outlined next steps needed to complete their work.

The City Council determined that The City should again create a task force to work on finishing the work of the 2023 group.

Electric Vehicle (EV) Rebate Program

The MN Department of Commerce is now accepting applications for the Electric Vehicle (EV) Rebate Program. The program launched on February 7, 2024. Completed applications will be reviewed on a first-come, first-served basis. The State of Minnesota has limited funds for the EV rebate. Please be aware that each rebate application will be processed individually to ensure program integrity. This means payments will not happen immediately.

BikeMN Electric-Assisted Bicycle Rebate Program

The 2023 Minnesota Omnibus Transportation Policy and Finance bill includes the creation of a new Electric-Assisted Bicycle Rebate Program. Since this is a brand new program that will be administered by the State of Minnesota, the specifics of when and how the program will work are yet to be determined. The amount of the rebate will be reduced based on your adjusted gross income. Therefore you will have to apply for a rebate certificate through the Minnesota Department of Revenue.

BikeMN will monitor the development of the program and share when the state will be ready to start taking applications and the details of how to apply with our members via email. BikeMN will also post it on our blog and in our e-news as soon as the details are announced.
