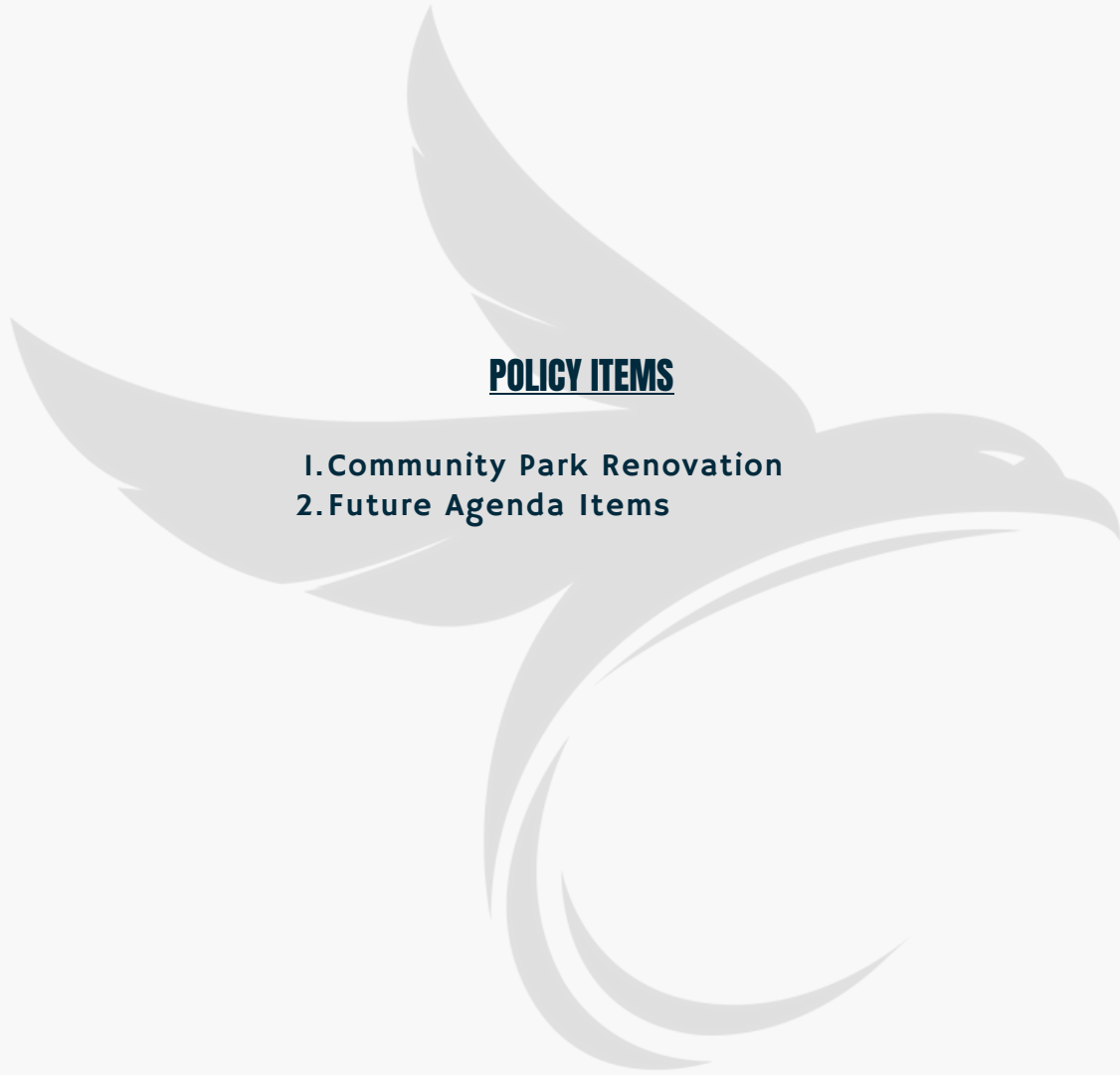

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT COMMISSION

The Community Engagement Commission advises the City Council on matters related to community needs and issues, crime and prevention, public awareness, community involvement, and human rights issues. The commission also helps plan and facilitate community events such as Human Rights Day and the Ice Cream Social.

The Community Engagement Commission meets on the third Monday of the month at 6:30 PM at City Hall.

PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

The Parks & Recreation Commission advises the Council on matters related to the operation of the City's public parks and the City recreation program.

Interim City Engineer

At its recent meeting on Wednesday, March 27, Falcon Heights City Council appointed Jennifer Lowry as the City's Interim City Engineer. For several years the City has contracted with the City of Roseville for engineering services. The City's current City Engineer, Stephanie Smith, has taken a job with another city and will be leaving her role as the Assistant City Engineer for the City of Roseville. We wish Stephanie all the best and thank her for her engineering services.

Get Pressed

The City of Falcon Heights received a grant for brownfield investigation from the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) for environmental investigation at the former Get Pressed laundromat site. A brownfield is an abandoned, blighted, or underused property where reuse is complicated by potential or actual contamination. This grant funds investigation of previous uses of the property to support redevelopment and reuse, and the work is performed by MPCA contractors at no cost to the grant recipient.

This week MPCA will be doing more sampling on site. They are working on gathering lab results and writing an action plan. Neal Kwong Award

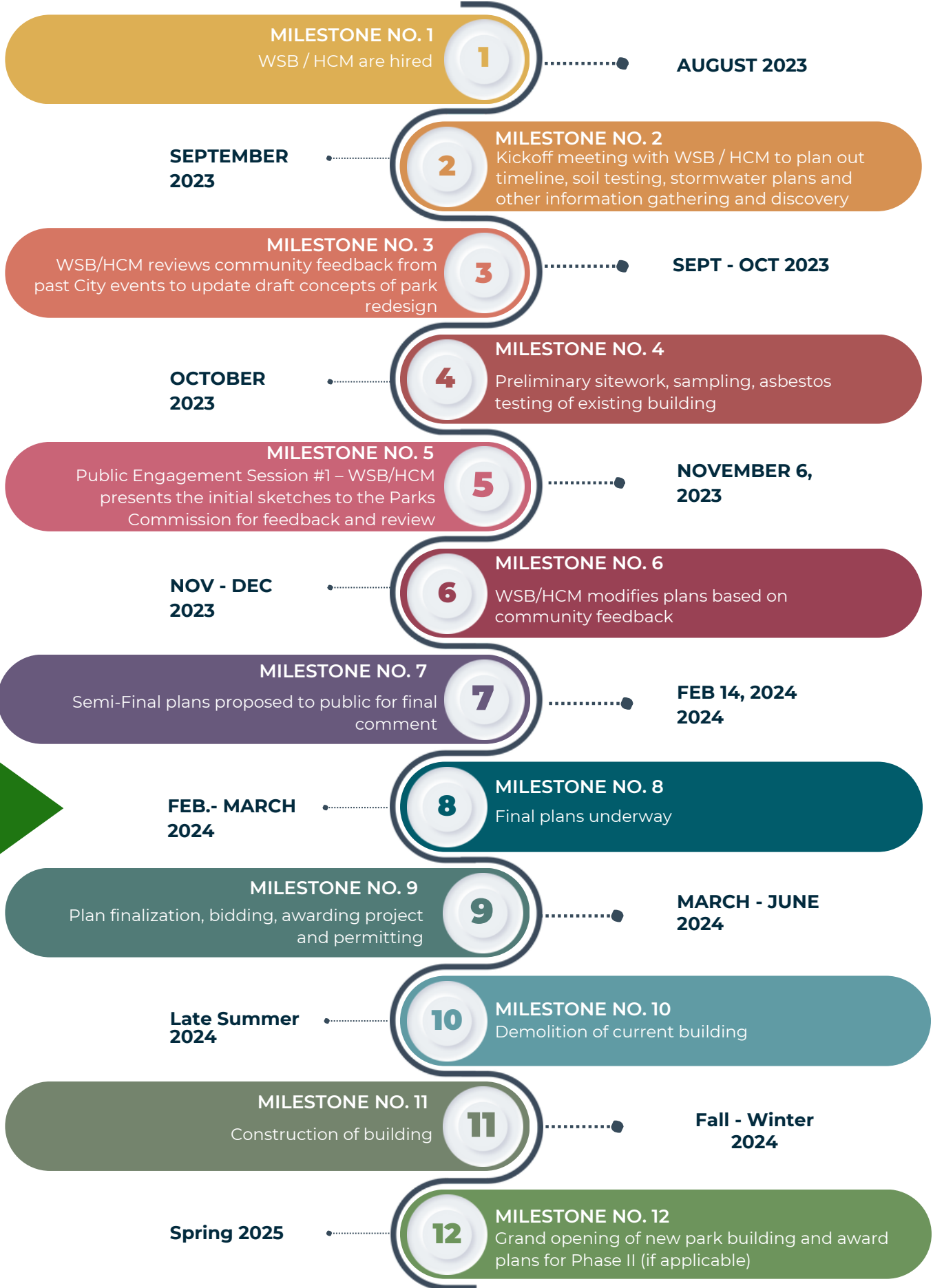

Share Your Input on a Potential Police Services Partnership With St. Anthony Village

City Council Wants Your Feedback

As the Falcon Heights City Council considers a potential partnership with St. Anthony Village's police department, City Councilmembers are looking to hear from residents.

The City of Falcon Heights has been looking for a long-term partner for police services since 2022. In 2022 and 2023, Falcon Heights conducted a study through the Center for Values-Based Initiatives to analyze the City's law enforcement services contract and needs. A series of three focus groups and a randomized resident survey were conducted to gather input on residents' priorities, building upon the extensive community feedback that informed Falcon Heights' Inclusion and Policing Task Force recommendations in 2017.

After carefully analyzing our needs and the available options, a potential renewed relationship with St. Anthony Village could be a good fit that aligns with the values of Falcon Heights residents identified in our previous engagement.

75th Anniversary

On April 1, 1949, by a vote of 5 to 1, the citizens rejected petitioning either Roseville or St. Paul for annexation and chose instead to establish their own independent village government. The incorporation of the Village of Falcon Heights brought in all of the remaining unincorporated areas of Rose Township, including the State Fairgrounds, University of Minnesota Campus Golf Course, and Test Fields. In 1973, the Village of Falcon Heights became a city.

CORRIDOR DEVELOPMENT STUDY

In early 2023, the City of Falcon Heights applied for and received a grant from Ramsey County to review the two most critical transportation corridors within the city, Snelling Avenue and Larpenteur Avenue. 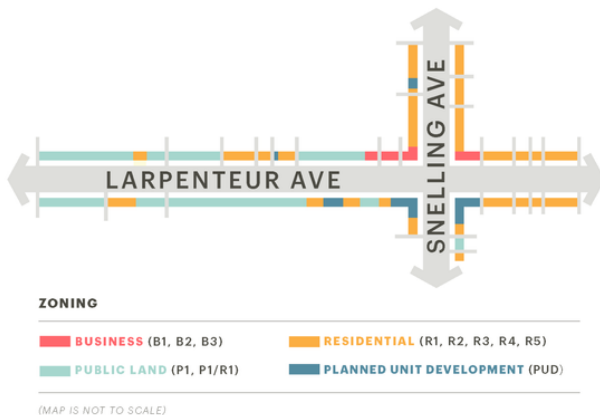
