PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION

The Parks & Recreation Commission advises the Council on matters related to the operation of the City's public parks and the City recreation program.

The Planning Commission advises the City Council on matters related to planning, zoning, and land use. Meetings are streamed [live from NineNorth](#) and televised on public access channel 15.

ENVIRONMENT COMMISSION

The Environment Commission advises the City Council on matters related to environmental issues, including recycling and waste disposal, community gardens, and stormwater runoff. 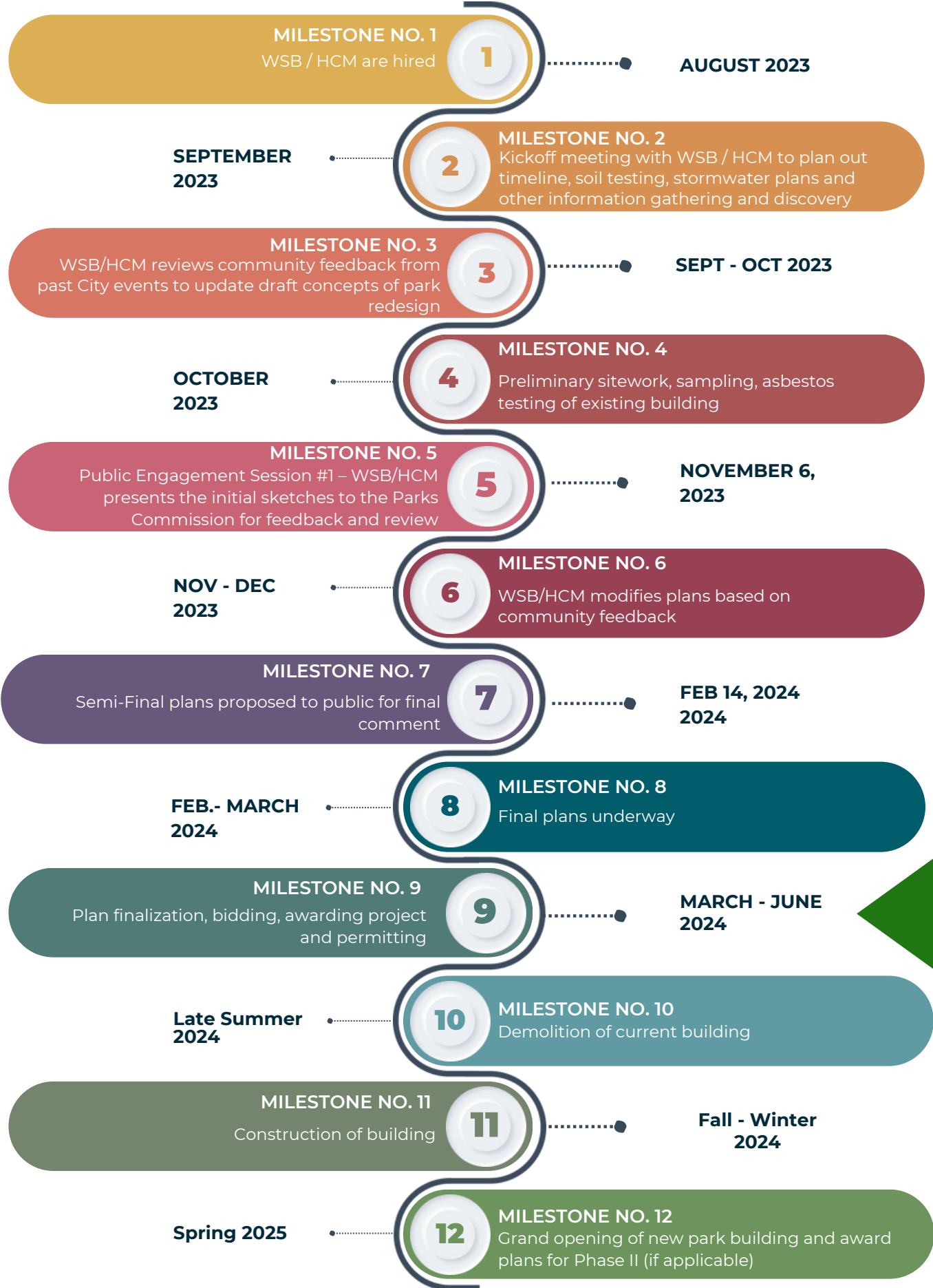

Stakeholder Input

Both Falcon Heights and St. Anthony Village gathered feedback through a community engagement process.

- An extensive door-knocking and in-person outreach effort to ensure traditionally hard-to-reach audiences were engaged.
- Engagement of the St. Anthony Police Department with the assistance of a consultant.
- Two joint Town Halls, where the results of the community engagement process were presented and the community was welcomed to provide additional feedback to the two councils as they considered a potential partnership.

Renewed Partnership Decision

On April 24, 2024 at 7 PM, The Falcon Heights City Council will discuss whether to move forward with a partnership with St. Anthony Village. This will be a decision on giving staff direction to enter into contract negotiations and address questions and concerns raised from all stakeholders' input.

A final decision on a renewed partnership would take place at a later date when a contract and all operational aspects are determined and finalized.

75th Anniversary

On April 1, 1949, by a vote of 5 to 1, the citizens rejected petitioning either Roseville or St. Paul for annexation and chose instead to establish their own independent village government. The incorporation of the Village of Falcon Heights brought in all of the remaining unincorporated areas of Rose Township, including the State Fairgrounds, University of Minnesota Campus Golf Course, and Test Fields. In 1973, the Village of Falcon Heights became a city.

Snelling & Larpenteur CORRIDOR DEVELOPMENT STUDY

In early 2023, the City of Falcon Heights applied for and received a grant from Ramsey County to review the two most critical transportation corridors within the city, Snelling Avenue and Larpenteur Avenue. The project is to evaluate the existing land uses along the two corridors and identify areas of potential future redevelopment and reinvestment to meet future housing and business needs.

The City received applications for a focus group as participants in the study and they had their first meeting on February 26, 2024
